Introduction to the CarePath Awareness Raising Info Days

The Awareness Raising Info Days are part of the CarePath project Work Package 5 (WP5), 'Dissemination and Sustainability'. This Work Package focused on the implementation of the project's dissemination and sustainability strategy, entailing the preparation of dissemination materials and the organisation of dissemination activities and events, all of which are intended to help 'build the case' for the CarePath project and its core messages around the integration of a trauma-informed approach within European aftercare support structures for children and young people ageing out of care.

The overall communication goal of the *CarePath project* will be to create 'added value' of project results as well as to spread and to successfully exploit the CarePath deliverables. With regard to specific objectives, the *Communication and Sustainability Plan* identified them as follows:

1. **In terms of communication:** To ensure high visibility of the project and to create and raise awareness towards relevant stakeholders at local, national and European levels
2. **In terms of dissemination:** To ensure effective dissemination of project deliverables and results to key targets and broader audiences in public, academic and non-governmental sectors at local, national and European levels
3. **In terms of sustainability:** To ensure that stakeholders are aware of availability of a free mechanism for integrated aftercare support and are enabled to use project results in their own work
4. **In terms of EU added value:** To promote the EU added value by demonstrating how EU funding contributes to tackling societal challenges and promoting the rights of the child.

Overview & structure of the CarePath project Awareness Raising Info Days

Under the project specifications for the CarePath project, five national awareness raising Info Days (1 in each country, 2 in Italy) were envisioned. The purpose of these sessions was to present the CarePath project, its results and to inform the wider audience about children's rights in relation to aftercare. It was envisioned that



at least 500 stakeholders would be engaged in this way across the five sessions, and that the events would be organised in the language of the hosting CarePath partner. The target audience was public authorities, professionals, training providers, students, adolescents in care and care leavers and the general public.

The Info Day sessions were supported with project communication materials and the project's web resources, developed under 'Deliverable 5.2.2 Communication Materials'. CarePath communication materials included were prepared in each partners' languages, and included:

- Consistent use of project logos and branding
- Project brochures
- Project flyers (both general and for the massively open online course (MOOC))
- Project banners

The project's social media channels, newsletters and partners' organisation's webpages and private mailing list were actively used to promote and support the Info Days' dissemination online to help these events reach higher audience participation and communicate the key messages to additional audiences.

As stated above, it was originally intended to host 5 larger events of 100 attendees each to reach 500 participants in total. However, as the project's lifecycle developed, the Project Partnership agreed that convening smaller, but more frequent Info Days would also enable the fulfillment of the goals of the project's Dissemination and Sustainability plan, and open the possibility for reaching an even wider and varied audience for the CarePath project.

Through the use of Information and Communication Technologies, the project partnership was able to engage wider audiences utilised by project partner and WP5 coordinator Eurochild to tap into its European-wide network. This online engagement in Info Day related activities was achieved through webinar format events as a part consequence to the required shift to online-based activities as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and its impacts on inter-European travel.

Finally, due to the withdrawal of one project partner, Regione Calabria, additional Info Days were organised in northern Italy to compensate for the lack of a session in the southern part of Italy, as initially planned.



By the project's close in 2020, **the CarePath's Awareness Raising Info Days sessions reached a total of 2,365 participants across the four countries of the project.** This far exceeds the original target of 500.

This result, and others related to the CarePath communications and dissemination activities are further discussed in the Deliverable 5.3.4: Dissemination Report.

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Trauma and Child rights

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
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Trauma (wound)

Individual trauma results from an event, series of events, or set of circumstances that is experienced by an individual as physically or emotionally harmful or life threatening and that has lasting adverse effects on the individual's functioning and mental, physical, social, emotional, or spiritual well-being.





ACE Adverse Childhood Event & Developmental Trauma, Complex PTSD

Abuse: Emotional • Physical • Sexual

Neglect : Emotional • Physical

Household Dysfunction:

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Re-enactment
Recreating the childhood dynamic expecting the same result but hoping for a different one. This strategy is doomed to failure because the need in the past and cannot be resolved. Also you will interpret anything in the past as confirmation that you have been betrayed once more.

Loss of safety
The world becomes a place where anything can happen

Loss of danger cues
How do you know what is dangerous when someone you trust hurts you and this is then your normal?

Loss of trust

This is especially true if the abuser is a family member or a close family friend.

Shame

Huge, overwhelming, debilitating shame. As a child, even getting an exercise wrong at school can trigger the shame. The child may grow into an adult who cannot bear to be in the wrong because it is such a trigger.

Loss of intimacy

For survivors of sexual abuse, sexual relationships can either become something to avoid or are entered into for approval (since the child learns that sex is a way to get the attention they crave) and the person may be labelled 'promiscuous'.

Dissociation
Often, to cope with what is happening to the body during the abuse, the child will dissociate (disconnect the consciousness from what is happening). Later, this becomes a coping strategy that is used whenever the survivor feels overwhelmed.

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

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

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

Στα πλαίσια του 1ου Plug and Play Συνέδριου Restart Mai City, που έλαβε χώρα στην πόλη των Τρικάλων στις 26 με 28 Σεπτεμβρίου 2019 και συγκρίμενα στο πάρκο του Ματσόπουλου, παρουσιάστηκε και το Έργο CarePath. Το CarePath είναι μια δεκτής πρωτοβουλία που στόχευε ήδη τη βελτίωση σε εθνικό και διεθνή επίπεδο των Υποστηρικτικών Δυούνων για την προστασία των ανηλίκων ώστε να παρέχουν εποριγματική υποστήριξη, ενιμερωμένη σχετικά με το ψυχικό τραύμα στα παιδιά που απομονών λόγω τραύματος. Η ομάδα Έργου του CarePath αποτελείται από το Eurochild, το Πανεπιστήμιο Università degli Studi di Torino, το Δήμο Καλαβρία, το Ιδρυμα IACP – Istituto dell'Approccio Centrato sulla Persona, τους Ελλήνες σταύρους ReadLab, e-Trikala, ERGO και την Οργανώμαντο Cordelia Foundation for the Rehabilitation of Torture Victims.

The CarePath project was presented as part of the 1st Plug and Play Conference Restart Mai City, which took place in Trikala on September the 26 to 28 2019 and specifically in Matsopoulos Park. CarePath project is a two-year initiative which aims to improve national and regional child protection systems in providing integrated aftercare support to children ageing out of care. The project team consists of Eurochild, Università degli Studi di Torino Regione Calabria (IACP – Istituto dell'Approccio Centrato sulla Persona), ReadLab, e-Trikala, ERGO and Cordelia Foundation for the Rehabilitation of Torture Victims. The participants and visitors were informed about the educational platform, which will run under CarePath in the coming months aiming toward professionals in the field of child support eg social workers, lawyers, psychologists, health professionals, teachers. The conference was attended by 465 delegates, 100 Municipalities and 50 speakers. Info sessions on the educational platform took place during the first two days at the e-trikala stand.



This e-mail is addressed to all Eurochild members active in our working group on children in alternative care. Apologies it is rather long.

The COVID19 crisis is impacting every aspect of our personal and professional lives. First & foremost, we hope you and your loved ones are all safe and well. We understand that your organisations & those working with you must be under particular strain as you adapt to minimise the health risks to staff & try to continue with vital services. We know that children and families you serve will be particularly vulnerable right now and many more will be struggling to cope with confinement measures, probably leading to an increased risk of violence against children.

The Eurochild team, all working from home since 12 March, are also trying to adjust to this new reality & to take stock of how our priorities & work needs to adapt to most meaningfully respond to this situation. We know the importance of getting information to decision-makers so that their emergency response and recovery plans take account of children's rights. We released a [public statement](#) last week drawing attention to some of the issues we see emerging. We realise, more than ever, the importance of connecting with members and the reality on the ground.

For that reason, we would like to organise an online meeting next week on 7th or 8th April specifically on the issue of children in alternative care. Please could you indicate your availability in this [doodle](#) by the end of this week, Friday 3 April. Apologies this is such late notice & don't worry if you cannot attend. We will try to connect more regularly with on-line meetings.

With this email I would also like to give you a brief update on the status of our different work-streams in the area of children in alternative care & the opportunities for you to engage.

1. Data mapping ("Data Care project")
The mapping of data collection systems on child protection across 27 EU Member States and the UK is continuing thanks to support from UNICEF Office for Europe & Central Asia. We recruited a senior research coordinator, Gaspar Fajth, who is now developing the research protocol. We had a first online meeting with a small number of researchers and experts with links to national authorities this week. We propose an online meeting Eurochild members to input to this work on 29th April (the original date of our General Assembly). Following this meeting, there will also be the opportunity to provide written feedback.
2. Technical assistance to member organisations to support advocacy on child protection reforms
As you are aware, thanks to a partnership with the Martin James Foundation, Eurochild has an open call for a small sub-grant to support member organisations in advocating on child protection reforms (deadline this Friday). We will be reviewing with applicants how to ensure this support can be most effectively deployed in view of the crisis. MIF are indeed encouraging us to be as flexible and responsive as possible, to ensure the resources are directed to where they are most needed.
3. Facilitating peer learning & exchange
For now we are still envisaging to hold a meeting for CiAC members on 1-2 October in Brussels. In the meantime though we will continue with more regular online meeting opportunities.
4. EU advocacy & influencing
We continue to engage with the European Semester process, reviewing country reports. With your support we hope to update Country Fact Sheets & send to European Commission officials in early Autumn. We are also closely following developments on the multi-annual financial framework. The debate is monopolised by COVID19 & the response right now. We need to monitor how our sector will be affected. We continue to engage with preparations for the EU Child Guarantee & the EU's comprehensive strategy on the rights of the child. Both initiatives are likely to still go ahead, but most likely with reduced resources. We stay active in the European Expert Group on the transition from institutional to community based care – which is also in the process of reviewing how best to respond as a community to this crisis.
5. Thematic papers on necessity & suitability principles
We envisaged that the funding from Martin James Foundation would help us to curate information on state-of-the-art related to the 'necessity' & 'suitability' principles. We expected to start work on the first paper – on the 'necessity principle' this Autumn, hiring an expert to support the research and drafting. We will be reviewing this activity in the light of the impact of the crisis
6. CarePath project
Eurochild is partner in this project focused on **trauma-informed care**. The project's findings & recommendations that CiAC members have previously provided feedback will be included in a Policy report. A [CarePath conference](#) on aftercare across Europe should be organised in Brussels in the Autumn.





1. **Lack of consistent and comparable data**
2. estimated 1 million children in the EU are in alternative care
3. Institutional care still widely used for children without adequate parental care across EU (BG, CZ, LT, LV, RO)
4. Placement of under 3s in institutions in several MS (CZ, RO)
5. certain vulnerable groups are overrepresented in care statistics (Roma children, children with disabilities)
6. Families facing poverty and social exclusion are at great risk of their children being taken into care
7. Many children with experience of care carry psychosocial problems into adulthood
8. Standards to protect the rights of children in alternative care still weak; participation of families & children is poor
9. **Peer led groups of children and young people who are living, or have lived, in alternative care are still too few in Europe**

Example 1: The Opening Doors Campaign

Common vision to end institutionalisation of children in Europe. This vision was transformed into a 7 year pan-European campaign.

- Ensure deinstitutionalisation is retained as a priority for the EU institutions, and **European States are encouraged to use EU funding and policy coordination tools** to reform their child protection systems via the transition towards family- and community-based care.
